


MBE Certification Process

Steps to Certification

- 1. Application Applicant submits a complete application and supporting documentation to Office of Minority Business Enterprise (OMBE). All applications can be submitted online. Please Note: The Federal DBE/ACDBE program requirements are separate from Maryland's MBE Program. Applicants are not required to seek both DBE/ACDBE and MBE certifications.
- 2. Investigation An investigator reviews documentation submitted by applicant, conducts an onsite/job-site visit and prepares an investigative report.
- 3. Evaluation The application and supporting documentation is evaluated to determine whether the firm meets the DBE/ACDBE/SBE program requirements. The Certification Review Committee evaluates whether the applicant firm meets Federal Certification program requirements.
- 4. Determination A written determination is issued from OMBE. DBE_ACDBE_SBE_Certification Overview.pdf (maryland.gov)
- 5. All Maryland firms or Out of State firms applying for MBE certification must be registered and in Good Standing with the Maryland Department of Assessment and Taxation (SDAT). Small Business Reserve (SBR) Certified Small Business Program



SBR Certification Process

The SBR program is a free, same day certification for prime contractors who meet the eligibility standards based on industry, number of employees and gross sales standards.

Small Business Reserve (SBR) Program

Maryland's Prime Contracting Program for Certified Small Businesses

- Same day certification
- Access to over \$500 million in state-funded contracts
- Over 20% of all open solicitations are designated to Certified Small Businesses

SBR Eligibility Standards

Certified Small Businesses must meet the following eligibility standards:


For the purposes of a Small Business Reserve Procurement, a small business is a for-profit business,

other than a broker, that meets the following criteria:

- A. It is independently owned and operated;
- B. It is not a subsidiary of another business;
- C. It is not dominant in its field of operation; and
- D. Either:

Industry: Must not exceed employees and gross sales below for the most recent 3 years

- Wholesale- did not employ more than 50 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$4,000,000
- Retail- did not employ more than 25 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$3,000,000
- Manufacturing- did not employ more than 100 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$2,000,000
- Service- did not employ more than 100 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$10,000,000
- Construction- did not employ more than 50 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$7,000,000
- Architectural and engineering- services of the business did not employ more than 100 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$4,500,000



Veteran-Owned Small Enterprise (VSBE) Program



VSBE Certification Process

The VSBE is both a prime and subcontracting certification program for veteran-

owned small businesses that meet the following eligibility standards:

1. Be a small business as defined by the United States Small Business Administration in

13 C.F.R. 121.201 and any subsequent revision of that regulation

2. Be at least 51% owned and controlled by one or more individuals who are veterans

3. Must be for-profit business

A veteran for this State program is defined as an individual who is verified as having served on active duty in the armed forces of the United States, other than for training, and was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.

NEW EXECUTIVE ORDER

Executive Order 01.01.2024.38

Delivering a More Efficient, Equitable, and Competitive Procurement System for Maryland

Effective immediately, all Procurement Officers are hereby directed to:

a. Designate a procurement as SBR if market research indicates that <u>two</u> or more certified small businesses under the SBR program can perform the work or provide the desired goods or services;


b. Proactively work with prime contractors to achieve or exceed contractual MBE and VSBE subcontracting goals in instances where the procurement officer is acting as the Contract Manager by performing annual reviews to identify compliance with those established contractual MBE and VSBE participation goals and if necessary, require corrective action plans from the prime contractors;


Introduction to NAICS

SMALL LOCAL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (SLBE) PROGRAM

- Race and gender-neutral program
- > Purpose is to promote the purchasing and procurement of goods and services from qualified small businesses headquartered and operating in **Charles County**
- County government created the SLBE program to support the growth and economic vitality of county businesses by increasing their success when they participate in county contracts





MINORITY AND WOMEN OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (MBE) PROGRAM

- County established a Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) Program in 2005 to promote the development and encouragement of minority business participation in the County's procurement process
- The County has a 25% MBE aspirational goal and conducts its own MBE registration program
- > EDD promotes an annual Shop Local campaign
- Hispanic and Latino, Asian, Black/African American, American Indians, etc.







SLBE and MWBE 2023 PROGRAM ACHIEVEMENTS

- 1,151 non-employer businesses operating in the county including: 218 Veteran Owned – 532 Minority Owned – 401 Female Owned

- In 2023, fifteen (15) businesses applied for and were certified by the county to participate in the county's SLBE Program 7 female and 8 male owned businesses.

DISPARITY STUDY WAS CONDUCTED TO ENSURE CONTRACTING EQUITY

- In 2020, the County conducted a disparity study to determine whether there was a disparity between the availability of firms and the utilization of those firms in the market area. The study analyzed county contracts offered during the fiscal years 2015-2019 in four industry categories construction, architectural and engineering, other services, and goods.
- The study showed that the County was underutilizing its minority and women owned businesses





Disparity Study Progress and Achievements

- Updates to disparity study's status report ongoing
- Disparity Study report on EDD website
- New MWBE/SLBE legislation proposed that updates both programs
- Board of County Commissioners approved the legislation
- County currently has an annual 25% MWBE aspirational goal on construction contracts valued over \$25,000
- In FY 23, 0.3% (not 25%) of those contracts awarded went to MWBE firms
- New goals proposed by the disparity study will be based on market analysis and established by a goal setting committee

BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT LOAN FUND FOR WOMEN, MINORITIES AND VETERANS

- > Offers micro-loans between \$5,000 to \$35,000 to small, disadvantaged (minority, women, or veteran-owned) businesses.
- Requirements:
- Must be a for-profit business and business located in Charles County, Maryland
- Operational for at least 2-3 years
- > Qualify as a Minority owned business enterprise, Woman owned business enterprise, and/or Veteran owned business enterprise
- Meet the Small Local Business Enterprise Program criteria
- Proceeds can assist with Working Capital Inventory Staffing
- Demonstrate that loan proceeds will help grow the business or enhance productivity or profitability
- Demonstrate the ability to repay the loan
- Not previously defaulted on an economic development loan with any local, state, or federal agency
- No delinguent debt with Charles County Government





TARGET INDUSTRY LOAN FUND

- \succ Offers funds to eligible businesses relocating or expanding within target industries (health services, federal contracting, technology, business services, retail development, R&D and engineering, innovative entrepreneurial activity)
- Provides up to \$100,000 and offers a 15yr repayment below prime rate
- Requirements:
- Demonstrate that loan proceeds will help grow the business or enhance productivity or profitability
- Demonstrate ability to repay the loan
- No delinquent debt with Charles County Government, State of Maryland, or Federal agency
- Proceeds can assist with Working Capital Inventory Staffing Purchase of equipment Building acquisitions or leasehold improvements • Contract financing • Gap financing
