

Liaison (noun)

A designated representative within a Maryland state agency or institution responsible for advancing supplier diversity and ensuring compliance with the state's MBE, VSBE and CSB (SBR) procurement goals.

Primary responsibilities include:

Coordinating and participating in vendor outreach events
Enforcing MBE/VSBE/CSB participation goals in procurement
Ensuring prime contractors adhere to MBE/VSBE/CSB subcontracting commitments
Leading and supporting contract dispute resolution efforts
Promoting MBE/VSBE/CSB opportunities to internal and external stakeholders
Providing guidance and support to MBE/VSBE/CSB -certified vendors
Reporting and tracking MBE/VSBE/CSB participation, contract awards, payments, and goal attainment

MBE Certification Process

Steps to Certification

- Application Applicant submits a complete application and supporting documentation to Office of Minority Business Enterprise (OMBE). All applications can be submitted online.
 Please Note: The Federal DBE/ACDBE program requirements are separate from Maryland's MBE Program. Applicants are not required to seek both DBE/ACDBE and MBE certifications.
- 2. Investigation An investigator reviews documentation submitted by applicant, conducts an on-site/job-site visit and prepares an investigative report.
- 3. Evaluation The application and supporting documentation is evaluated to determine whether the firm meets the DBE/ACDBE/SBE program requirements. The Certification Review Committee evaluates whether the applicant firm meets Federal Certification program requirements.
- Determination A written determination is issued from OMBE.

- 5. All Maryland firms or Out of State firms applying for MBE certification must be registered and in Good Standing with the Maryland Department of Assessment and Taxation (SDAT). Use the following link to check a firms Good Standing status or register a business Register Your Business Online, or contact SDAT at 888-246-5941.

Types of Certification

Federal (Only) DBE/ACDBE/SBE Certification

OMBE highly recommends applicants complete the Uniform Certification Application for firms seeking DBE certification. OMBE will use this single application to evaluate candidates for eligibility in both programs simultaneously. Applicants can also elect to be evaluated for ACDBE certification in addition to the MBE and DBE Certifications.

Small Business Reserve (SBR) Certified Small Business Program









The SBR program is a free, same day certification for prime contractors who meet the eligibility standards based on industry, number of employees and gross sales standards.

Small Business Reserve (SBR) Program

Maryland's Prime Contracting Program for Certified Small Businesses

- Same day self-certification
- Close to half a Billion dollars in state-funded contracts paid to Certified Small Businesses (CSBs) in FY2024
- An average of 30% of all state-funded open solicitations are SBR Designated for Certified Small Businesses (CSBs)

SBR Eligibility Standards



Certified Small Businesses must meet the following eligibility standards:

For the purposes of a Small Business Reserve Procurement, a small business is a <u>for-profit business</u>, <u>other than a broker</u>, that meets the following criteria:

- A. It is independently owned and operated;
- B. It is not a subsidiary of another business;
- C. It is not dominant in its field of operation; and
- D. Either:

Industry: Must not exceed employees and gross sales below for the most recent 3 years

- Wholesale- did not employ more than 50 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$4,000,000
- Retail- did not employ more than 25 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$3,000,000
- Manufacturing- did not employ more than 100 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$2,000,000
- Service- did not employ more than 100 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$10,000,000
- Construction- did not employ more than 50 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$7,000,000
- Architectural and engineering- services of the business did not employ more than 100 persons and operations did not exceed an average of \$4,500,000



Veteran-Owned Small Enterprise (VSBE) Program





VSBE Certification Process



The VSBE is both a prime and subcontracting certification program for veteran-owned small

businesses that meet the following eligibility standards:


- 1. Be a small business as defined by the United States Small Business Administration in
 - 13 C.F.R. 121.201 and any subsequent revision of that regulation
- 2. Be at least 51% owned and controlled by one or more individuals who are veterans
- 3. Must be **for-profit** business

A veteran for this State program is defined as an individual who is verified as having served on active duty in the **Uniformed Services** of the United States, other than for training, and was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.




Introduction to NAICS

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is the standard classifying business establishments for the purpose of collecting, analyzing U.S. business economy.

NAICS was developed under the auspices of the Office of Management and the <u>Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system</u>. It was developed jointly <u>Committee (ECPC)</u>, <u>Statistics Canada</u> \rightarrow , and Mexico's <u>Instituto Nacional de</u> level of comparability in business statistics among the North American cou

- · Full exploitation of electronic commerce capabilities

eMMA is Maryland's new online procurement platform used to connect the vendor community with contracting opportunities from state, county, and local government entities. Registered vendors will receive notices of bid opportunities, can submit bid responses online, and may obtain bid results online.

Qualified small business vendors may also complete two self-certification processes to become eligible for the following certifications/programs:


- 1) The Certified Small Business CSB Certification (includes the Small Business Reserve (SBR) and Small Business Preference (SBP) Programs) and/or
- 2) The Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) Program Certification.


::: eMMA Registration TIPS

Your Own laptop- not compatible with mobile devices

Password- Must be 12 characters including an upper case, a lower case, a number and a symbol.

EIN Tax ID Number- You must have this 9-digit number to register your business as a vendor.

Commodity Codes- UNSCPS Codes- each business must place at least one of these codes under your account. It is best to write that down to manually input that number. https://www.ungm.org/public/unspsc

Inderstanding MARYLAND PROCUREMENT

What's the difference between an IFB and an RFP?

Invitation for Bid

- Lowest price wins
- Requirements are clearly defined
- No negotiations after bid submission
- Often used for routine services
- Award based on a responsive bid from a responsible bidder

VS

Request for Proposals

- Evaluated on best value, not just price
- Includes technical approach to statement of need
- Allows for negotiation and clarification
- Ideal for complex or customized solutions
- Scored on weighted criteria
